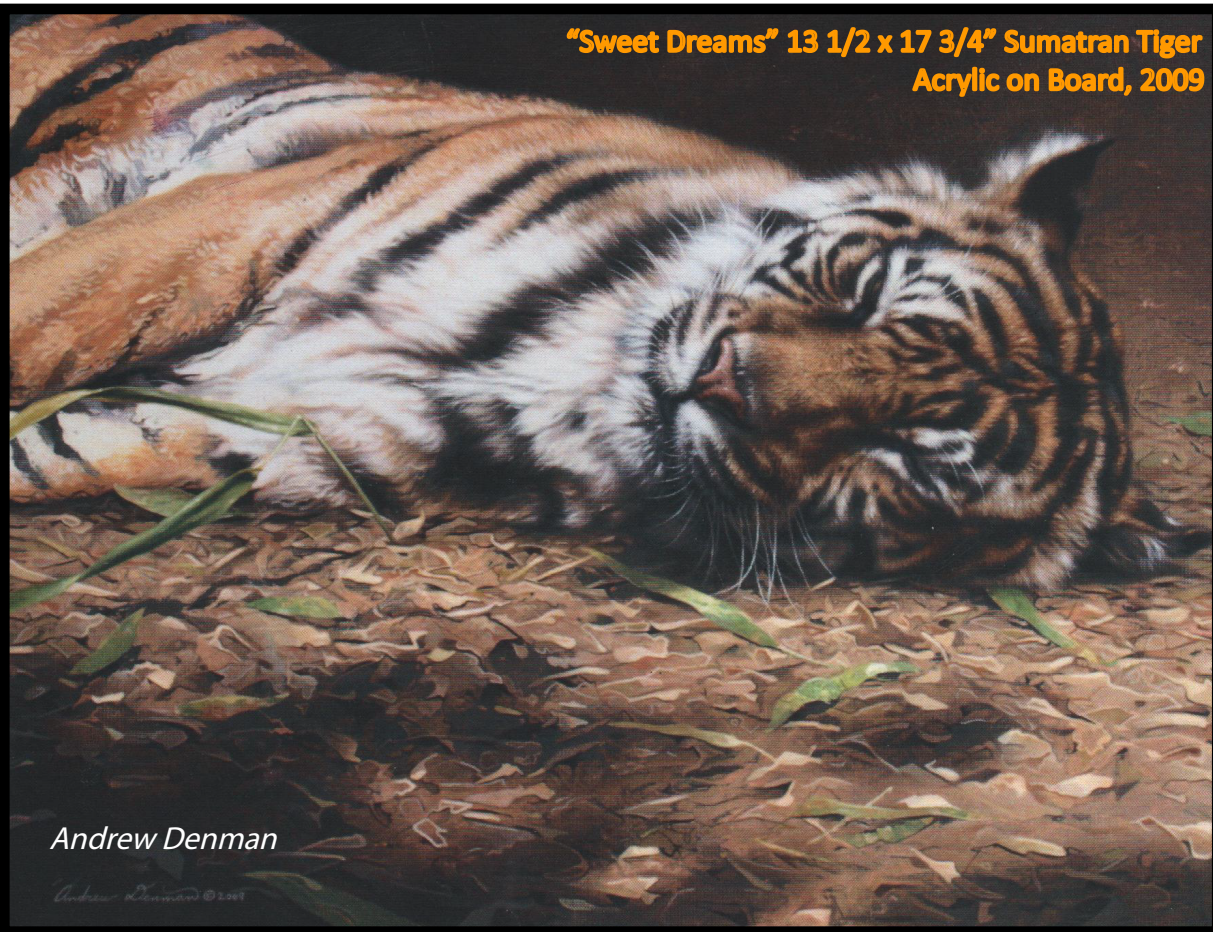
The Move Is Complete

Two days before Christmas we moved the last of the wild cats - "Rascal" the serval - to the new facility on Harstine Island. It's a huge relief having all of them in the same place. Two of the new large natural habitats are done (housing "Buddy & Yukon" bobcats and "Meeka & Gizmo" servals). Now we have the daunting task of raising funds for the construction of 20 more habitats @ \$2,000 each. Until those are completed the cats are being kept in temporary holding enclosures.

The wild cats in their new large habitats are enjoying their new and improved "freedom" - although sometimes they would just rather rest in their comfy dens. Typical cats!
